Upcoming meeting dates, meeting agendas and directions

Information about organization dues

Posting of annual business meeting minutes

Information about meetings or lectures by speakers of interest to others in genetics occurring in NC or surrounding areas

National or state news of interest to those in genetics in North Carolina Information about research studies of interest to those in genetics in North Carolina Information about activities sponsored by NCMGA

Job listings will be considered and a fee may be charged for posting. Please contact the current secretary/treasurer for more information.

Other messages will be considered by the officers on an individual basis depending on whether they fit with the purpose and goals of the organization and listserv. NCMGA officers will monitor the listserv so that the number of messages received does not become burdensome for members. Student members of NCMGA do not receive the listserv, but are welcome to participate in NCMGA meetings.
